Who we are and what we do

Who we are

Comann nam Pàrant (Dùn Èideann is Lodainn) is the local group that represents parents and children across the Edinburgh and Lothians areas.

We campaign for the development of Gaelic Medium Education.

We liaise with families and advocate on their behalf.

We work with other organisations such as City of Edinburgh Council, the Scottish Government and other groups.

The group is part of the national organisation Comann nam Parant Naiseanta.

Our campaigns

We campaigned for the Council's Gaelic Language Plan to include a standalone GME primary school.

We successfully campaigned against the Council's proposal to cap the number of pupils able to access GME.

We campaigned for primary education in Edinburgh, resulting in the creation of a standalone primary school at Bun-sgoil Taobh na Pàirce.

In 2016, we campaigned to stop the Council limiting the GME intake into James Gillespie's High School.

We campaigned for the inclusion of a GME secondary and a secure pathway for pupils through GME in the Council's second Gaelic Language Plan (2018-2022).

Now, in working towards a GME High School for Edinburgh, we continue to advocate for families throughout their journey in Gaelic Medium Education.

Our work in 2020-21

Our main work has centred around the statutory consultation.

We engaged with families, undertook a survey and wrote a report on our findings.

We submitted a verbal and written deputation to the Council.

We have written to Scottish Government and to City of Edinburgh Council, raising our concerns and questions around the consultation.

We responded to press queries from BBC Alba, including interviews on Aithris na Maidne and Radio nan Gàidheal.

Where we are now

We're now looking ahead to the statutory consultation on a GME high school for Edinburgh.

We'll continue to work with the Council and the Scottish Government, and engage families throughout the process

We anticipate further work on surveys, reports, lobbying and campaigning to ensure the needs of GME families are represented, supported and reflected throughout the process.

In addition, we want to increase engagement from families from across the GME community.

There is a lot of work ahead and we need your support.

We meet monthly via zoom to discuss issues, plan our work and to share information.

We have representatives from both parent councils at Bun-sgoil Taobh na Pàirce and James Gillespie's High School.

Our work includes research, writing and presenting reports, supporting local and national initiatives, promoting Gaelic activity and providing information to families.
